

Benguela Current: Geographical location




Benguela Current

- The Benguela Current Upwelling System is one of the four major eastern ocean boundary current regions of the world oceans.
- This Current is situated on the southwestern shelf of Africa, covering the coasts of Angola, Namibia and South Africa.
- The other currents are: California Current system, the Peru Upwelling system and the Northwestern African Upwelling System.
- The Benguela Current is unique: a cold water system bounded by two warm water regimes (Angola Current up north and Agulhas retroflexion area in the south).
- In common with other upwelling systems, the Benguela Current is dominated by a wind driven coastal upwelling system.
- Such coastal upwelling, results in high primary productivity which supports large commercial fisheries.
- Some of the major fish species in the Benguela, such as Hake, Horse Mackerel and Pilchard are transboundary along the coasts of Angola, Namibia and SA.


Shared Stocks Management

- The Benguela Current Commission (BCC) was established to assist the 3 countries in the region (Angola, Namibia and South Africa) in managing their shared stocks.
- Currently, joint biomass surveys for Pilchard are conducted by Angolan and Namibian scientists, using the Namibian Research Vessel Welwitchia.
- A joint Pelagic Working Group comprising of Angolan and Namibian scientists was also established to deal with issues related to shared Pelagic species, namely Pilchard and Horse Mackerel
- Joint surveys for hake recruitment and migration are also conducted for Namibia and South Africa, using the Norwegian Research Vessel Dr Fridtjof Nansen.

Way forward on the management of shared stocks

- Joint Management of shared stocks is currently being considered through BCC.
- Such joint management shall implement recommendations from the joint researches currently being undertaken.
- Recommendations from joint research include:
 - Harmonization of policies and legislations
 - setting of a joint TACs for shared stocks.
 - Joint monitoring and enforcement of regulations.
 - Regional capacity building.
