Context: Why now?



- 117. The Committee commended FAO for the global forum on rights-based approaches... welcomed the initiative of FAO on the complex topic of rights-based approaches for fisheries.
- 119. The Committee welcomed the Global Work Programme (GWP) and underlined that FAO... should serve as the neutral platform for advancing knowledge on rights-based approaches.
- 120. Many Members provided regional experience and expressed appreciation of the global forum. They
 also welcomed the follow-up activities and highlighted that the Policy Framework and Reform Strategy for
 Fisheries and Aquaculture in Africa (PFRS) already supported the promotion of rights-based approaches.
 - 4.1.4.2: "Design and apply appropriate user rights-based systems"
- 121. The Committee underlined the important role of FAO in providing knowledge, institutional support and assistance for developing rights-based fisheries management systems.
- 123. Members recommended the creation of a database for existing rights-based management systems.





Content: What is UserRights 2018?

- Information, experience sharing: 8 concurrent sessions on tenure types, issues
 - 1. customary tenure rights and indigenous peoples' tenure rights in fisheries
 - **2. open access** fisheries
 - **3. limited access** fisheries: input controls (licenses, IEs, TURFs)
 - 4. limited access fisheries: output controls (TACs, IQs, CDQs, Catch Shares, QMS)
 - 5. the post harvest sector
 - **6. competing fisheries stakeholders** (migratory fishing, industrial and SSF, national, regional, international issues)
 - 7. multiple use in coastal zone management and rights (aquaculture, MPAs, tourism, etc.)
 - **8. social aspects** of tenure and user rights in fisheries (human rights, right to food, gender, indigenous peoples, youth)

• Examining linkages: between tenure, rights-based approaches, and achieving SDGs
