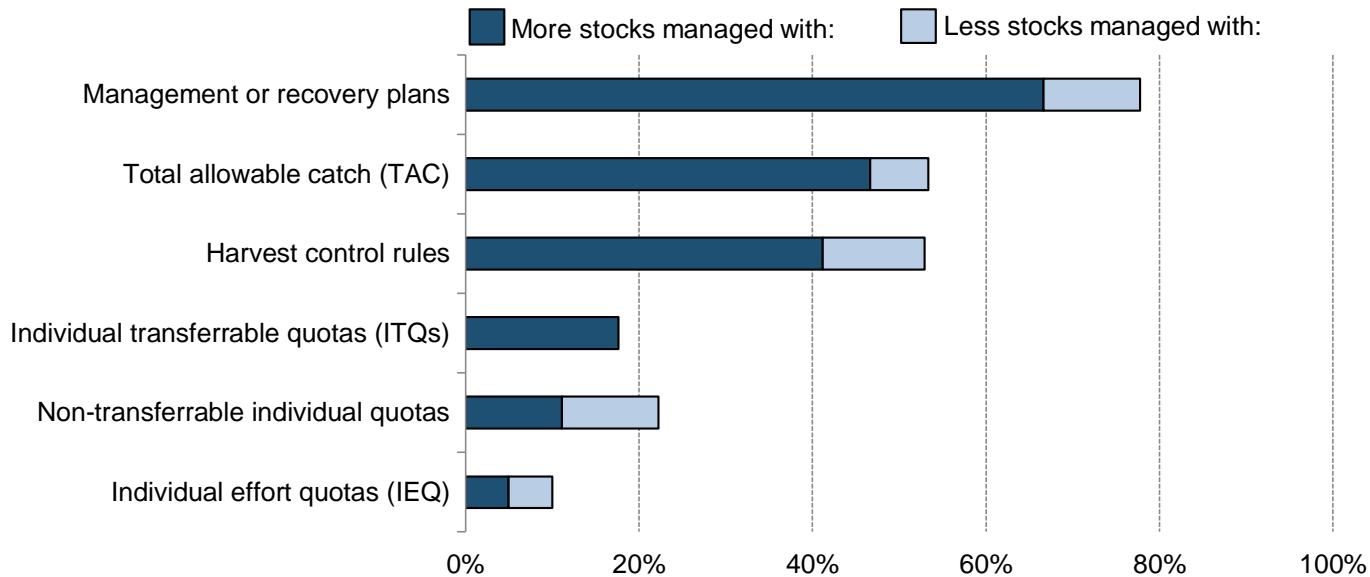

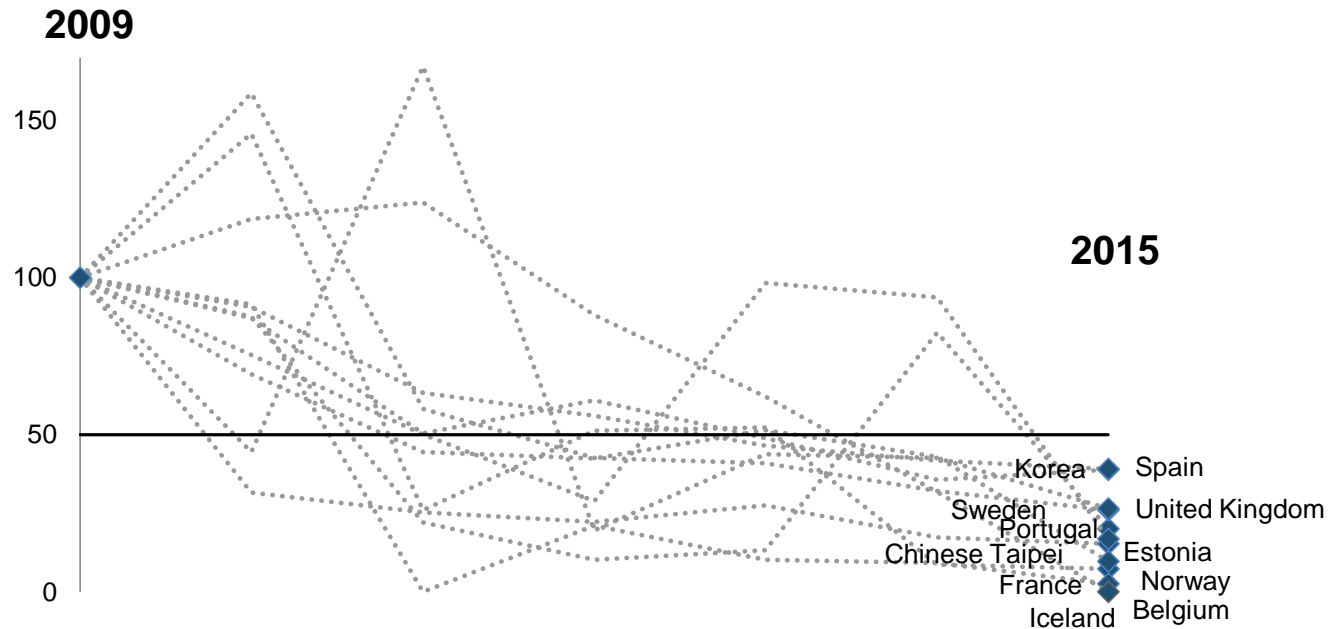
A decade of fisheries reform in the OECD

% of countries in the survey reporting change in number of stocks managed with:



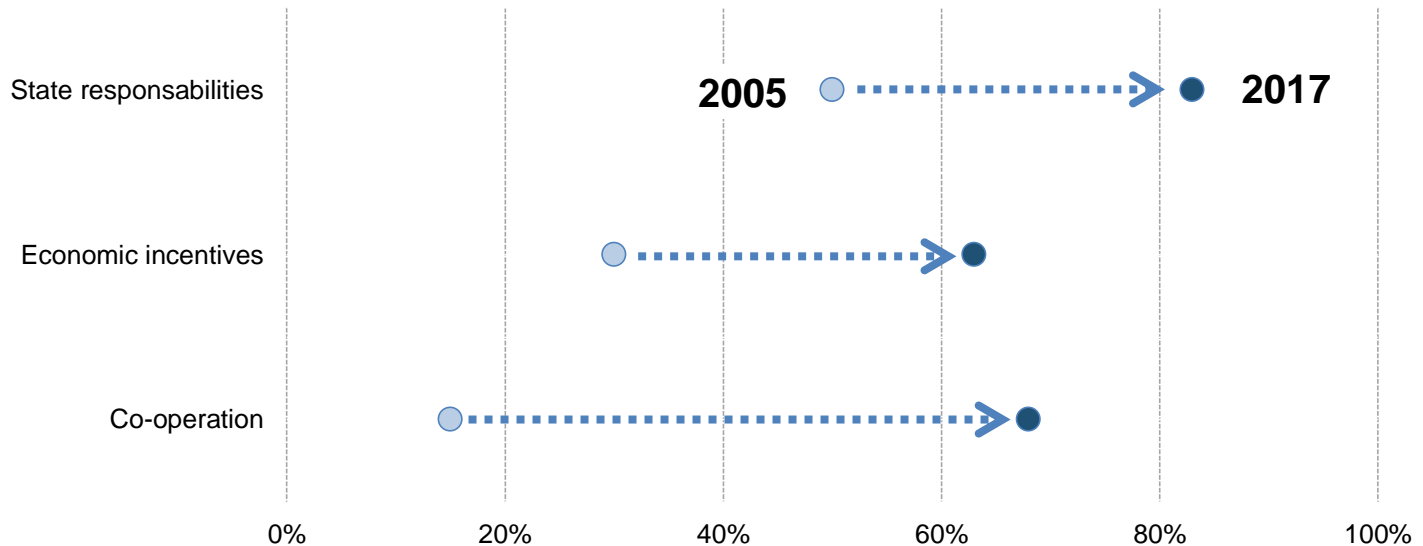
Direct transfers to fishers have declined by more than half since 2009 in a number of countries

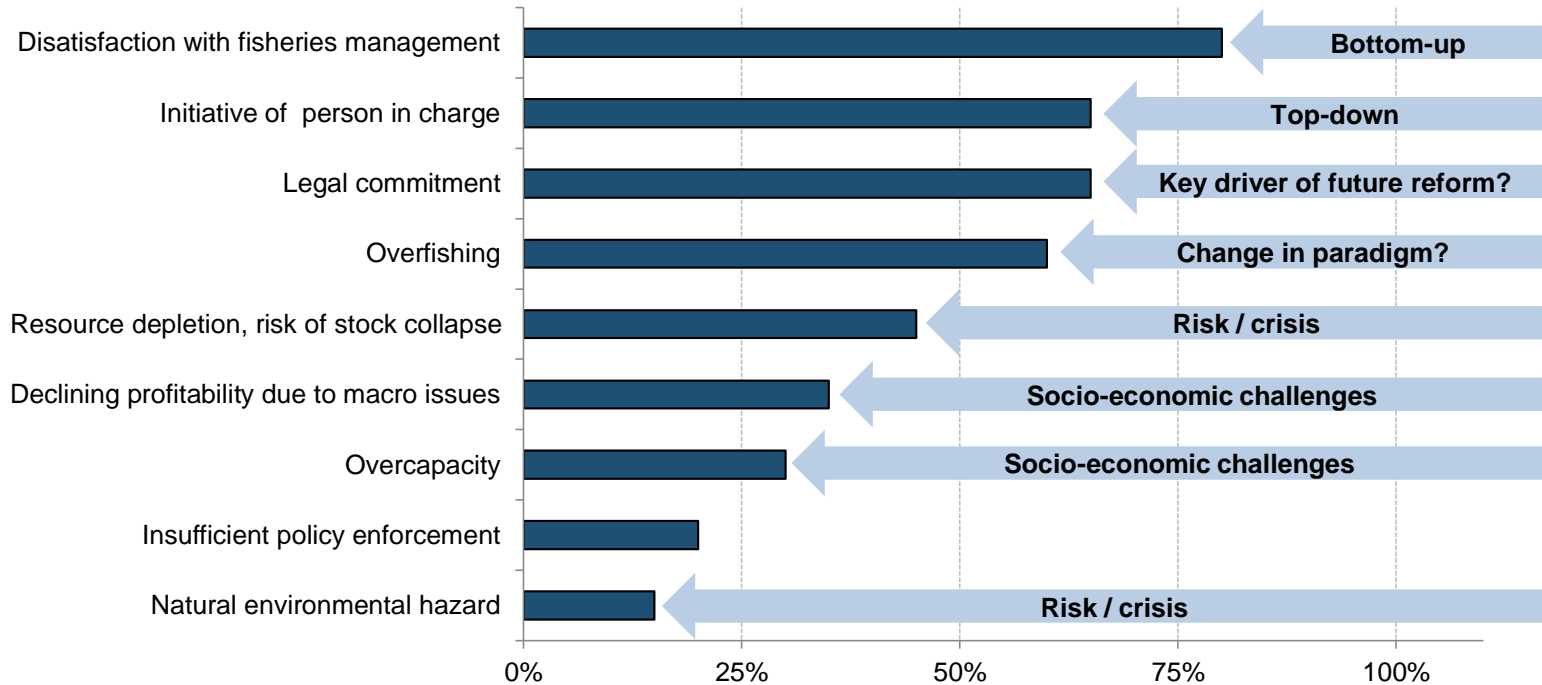

What triggered fisheries reform?

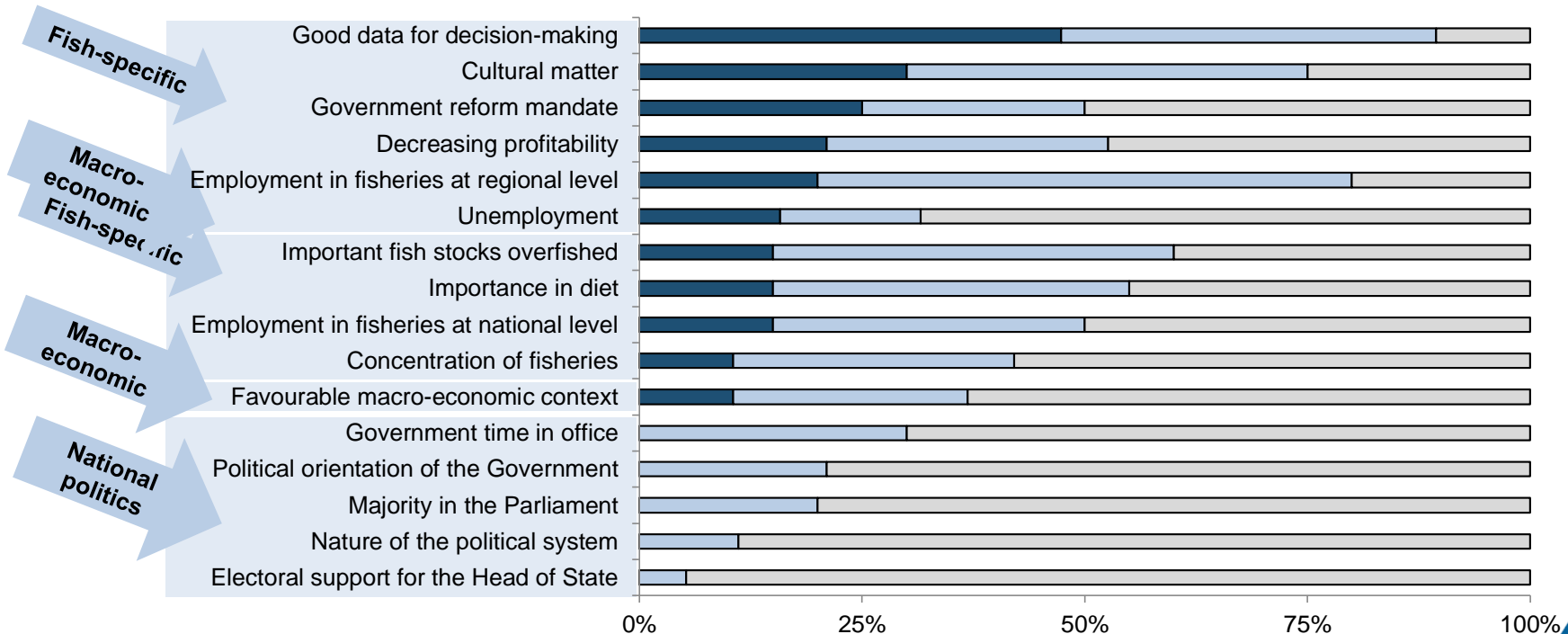
Percentage of surveyed reforms for which these issues were seen as key drivers of reform initiation



Which contextual factors mattered for fisheries reforms?

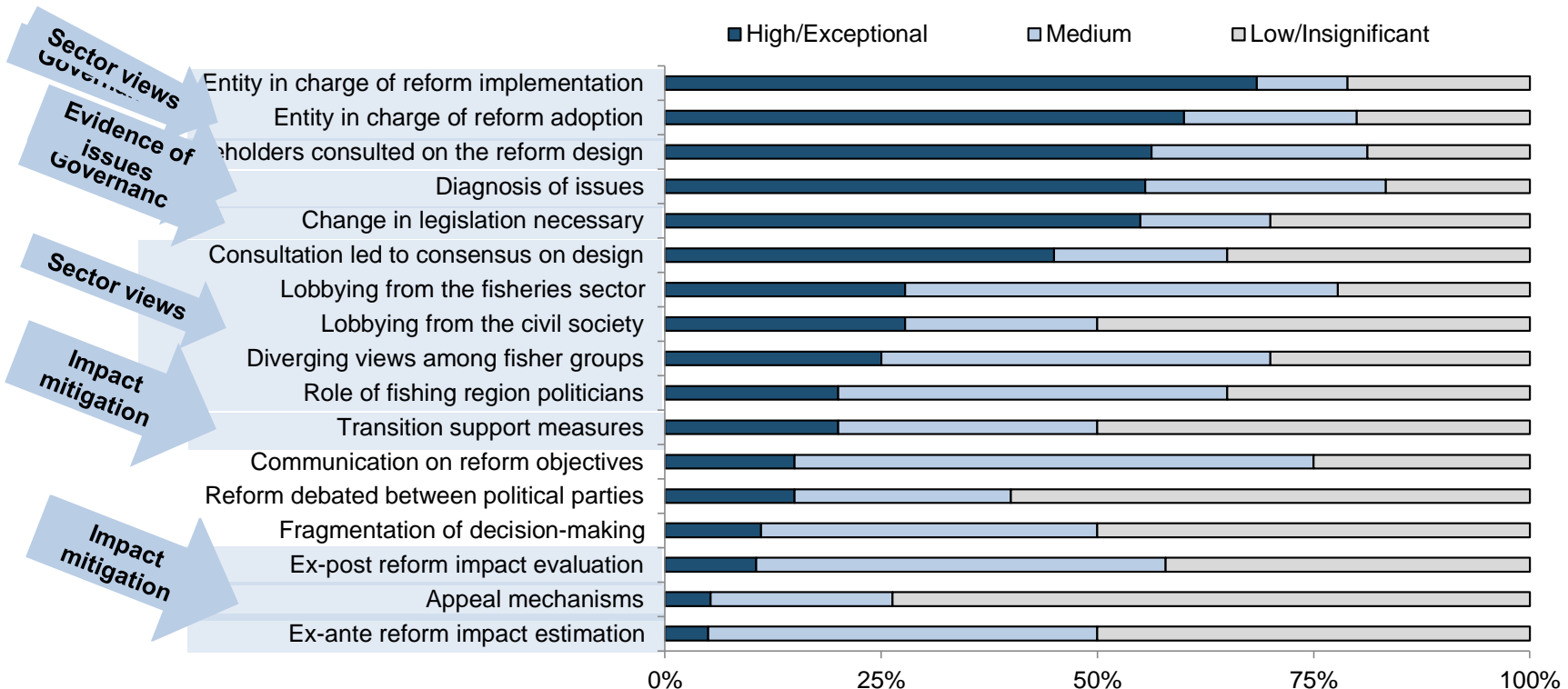
Percentage of surveyed reforms for which the impact of these factors was seen as:
