



O AFD AND THE OCEAN

1/ Project portfolio in 2019

- around 500 MEUR only in fisheries, aquaculture, marine and coastal ecosystems and resilience
- Around 1 BEUR for reduction of marine pollution (wastewater treatment, waste management)
- Mapping of "ocean projects" for all AFD group (private sector, civil society, urban development, transport, etc.)

2/ Capitalization of ocean projects since 20 years

- "Ocean projects" = support to sectors, activities, actors directly using, protecting, impacting marine and coastal environments
- Focus on the work of the Agriculture, Rural Development and Biodiversity division (living resources and protection of ecosystems)
- 10% of the division's projects linked with the ocean (€)
- 1 BEUR invested in ocean related projects in this division since 2000
- +75% investments in ocean-related projects since 2016 (including those under preparation)

- ⇒ improvement of the performance of coastal and artisanal fisheries sector
- ⇒upgrading the sanitary standards of infrastructure, equipment, modernization / centralization of the information and traceability system improvement of the management of port services.
- ⇒ 1 MEUR grant Trade Capacity Building for Private Sector and ONP

Prevention of pollution from the seas and lands – waste management and sanitation

- => Grants of € 3m AFD and € 0.2m FFEM
- => Public co-management / civil society with the ten villages included in the terrestrial perimeter of the Park
- => Endowment of the Park trust fund

BACOMAB - Coastal and Marine
Biodiversity of Banc d'Arguin - Mauritania

- =>Grants of 2.5 M € AFD and 1 M € FFEM
- => Capitalization of the trust fund
- => Long-term financing of Protected Areas


AFD and Oceans – multi donors and regional approaches


- Blue Action Fund: contribution of 5 MEUR for marine protected areas in developing countries (KfW/BMZ/Sweden/AFD – 68MEUR)
- Initiative Clean Oceans: 720 MEUR of commitments for the next
 5 years to prevent marine littering KfW/BEI/AFD
- PROBLUE: 1MUSD contribution to the World Bank trustfund on Blue Economy
- Conservation trustfund for MPA of the Mediterranean Sea:
 4MEUR capitalization for recurrent costs of MPAs at a regional level

AFD AND THE OCEAN – increasing attention to the ocean

- Most of the projects are recent (high proportion in identification or feasibility studies)
- There are more projects in preparation in 2019 than project commitments in the last 20 years.
